HIGHLIGHTS & SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

ADMINISTRATIVE DIVISION

- **Recruiting, Academy and Training**
 - Recruited at MDC 18 hours in the BLE Academy.
 - Taught at MDC 16.5 hours at MDC in the BLE Academy
 - Officers attended 5 trainings
- **Personnel**
 - Processing:
 - 3 Police Officer
 - 5 Police Cadet
 - 16 PCO
 - Schedule PCO, Police Officer and Police Cadet interviews
 - Hired Crime Scene Technician
 - Enrolled 2 Police Cadets in the Police Academy starting August 2024
- **Communications**
 - Answered approximately 2,128 incoming calls for police service.

OPERATIONS DIVISION

- **Road Patrol**
 - Calls for Service: 8526; Including: Watch Orders: 2498; Night Eyes: 784; Community Contacts: 887
 - 109 arrests (36 Felonies) this month. 617 Traffic Stops.
Notable arrests:
 - Robbery (Domestic): Units responded to a DCF complaint via WhatsApp from the victim, revealing her son had smashed her phone during an argument; he was arrested and transported to TGK without incident.
 - Sexual Battery (Minor Child): A 9-year-old girl with a mental capacity of a 5-year-old reported sexual battery by her uncle; officers took the report at her home, arrested the uncle when he arrived, and DB and Crime Scene processed the scene.
 - Officer assisted FBI Agents with a standby during an interview. After the subject initially avoided contact, he was later found at Starbucks with a firearm; officers conducted a pat-down and retrieved the weapon, revealing the defendant was a convicted felon with twelve prior convictions.
 - Officers located a subject burglarizing a 2011 BMW. The subject was taken into custody without incident.

OPERATIONS DIVISION (Continued)

- **Road Patrol (Continued)**
 - Officers found a defendant, who was attempting to break into a vacant house in Z5 using a metal pipe and other tools. The subject, who admitted he intended to live there and had been monitoring the house for 12 months, confessed to trying to change the locks.
 - The subject was located Z3 and charged with Burglary of an unoccupied structure, Possession of Ammunition by a Convicted Felon.
- **EOC (Emergency Operations Center)**
 - Crisis Track Training attended at Miami-Dade EOC
- **SRT (Special Response Team)**
 - SRT served a narcotics-related search warrant for TIU in Highland Village. Crack cocaine, powder cocaine, fentanyl powder, and marijuana were seized from the property. In addition, an arrest relating to drug possession with intent to sell charges was made.
 - SRT served a narcotics-related search warrant for TIU in Z1. Crack cocaine, powder cocaine, marijuana, and a firearm were seized from the property. In addition, arrest charges relating to cocaine possession with a firearm, cocaine possession with intent to sell and firearm possession by a convicted felon charges have been made.
- **FTO (Field Training Officer) Program**
 - **PPO Alain Batista**
 - Completed the FTO Program and has been a solo officer since July 17, 2024.
 - **PPO Christopher Ramirez**
 - PPO Ramirez started Phase 3 (Rephase) of the FTOP on July 13, 2024, with FTO Villalonga on the afternoon shift.
 - Strengths: PPO Ramirez has shown improvements in the following areas: Radio transmissions, driving skills, report writing, and performance on calls.
 - Weaknesses: PPO Ramirez struggles with consistency, performing well on some calls but not others, and is not responding to training. Due to these issues and forgetfulness.
 - **PPO Daphne St. Jules**
 - Started Phase 2 of the FTOP on Thursday, July 25th, 2024. She is assigned to FTO Milfort on afternoon shift.
 - Strengths: Writes timely and accurate reports, demonstrates good knowledge of the jurisdiction and criminal statutes, and communicates clearly on the radio, is respectful in interactions, manages her time well, and effectively applies her understanding of criminal elements.
 - Weaknesses: needs to improve in her ability to drive in emergency mode as well as responding to high priority calls.

- **FTO (Field Training Officer) Program (Continued)**
 - ***PPO Nabeel Tahir***
 - Started Phase 2 of the FTOP on Thursday, July 25th, 2024. He is assigned to FTO Burgos on dayshift.
 - Strengths: Displays a strong understanding of the jurisdiction and Florida Statutes, responds effectively to calls, and communicates clearly on the radio without needing assistance.
 - Weaknesses: Needs to improve his investigative skills and information gathering, as well as his time management, but his FTO notes that he is showing improvement in these areas.
 - ***PPO Woobens Noel***
 - Started Phase 1 of the FTOP on Thursday, July 25th, 2024. He is assigned to FTO Elder on afternoon shift.
 - Strengths: Has a good attitude, accepts accountability, is receptive to feedback, learns quickly, has a solid grasp of the jurisdiction, and writes well-structured reports with minimal assistance.
 - Weaknesses: Needs to improve his grammar and spelling, assertiveness in high-stress situations and pat-downs, and radio communication procedures.
 - ***PPO Robert Rose***
 - Started Phase 1 of the FTOP on Thursday, July 25th, 2024. He is assigned to FTO Topper on Midnight shift.
 - Strengths: Intelligent, has a good attitude, is eager to learn, familiar with the jurisdiction, and communicates well with civilians; he is also learning how to structure police reports effectively.
 - Weaknesses: Needs to improve his radio communication procedures and avoid rushing, as this causes him to miss information and make his transmissions hard to understand.
 - ***CSO Herbens Joseph***
 - Started Phase 1 of the FTOP on Thursday, July 4th, 2024. He is assigned to FTO Pierre on afternoon shift.
 - Strengths: Fluent in Creole, providing valuable translation services for citizens, and consistently shows up to work on time and well dressed.
 - Weaknesses: Needs to improve his report articulation, basic responsibilities like advising arrival and using his BWC, and his radio communication skills, which may impact his progression to Phase 2 without further improvement.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP DIVISION

- **Events Attended**

- Victory Park Pool Party event for 4th of July

During another incident, a juvenile was left on a boat while two divers were under water. The boat drifted away, leaving the divers stranded. The divers (2) were recovered and the boat was found with the juvenile on board. All parties safe.
- Motors and CP spoke with the owner of the U-haul on the West side of NMB. Agreements were made to stop parking U-Haul trucks on public parking.

INVESTIGATIVE DIVISION

- In July, detectives focused on leads related to an active homicide that occurred on July 7th, 2024.
- Detectives made an arrest in the Yeshiva Toras Chaim burglary. One adult male was charged accordingly.
- Detectives made an arrest of an adult male for Sexual Battery on a 9-year-old victim
- Numerous Grand Theft cases were cleared when an adult female was arrested by Detectives that was also wanted in neighboring jurisdictions.
- NMBPD TIU Detectives on Wednesday, July 24, 2024, concluded a narcotics investigation by serving a residential warrant. During the warrant two adult males were arrested. Numerous narcotics and a firearm were recovered during the search. Both males were charged with numerous felonies.

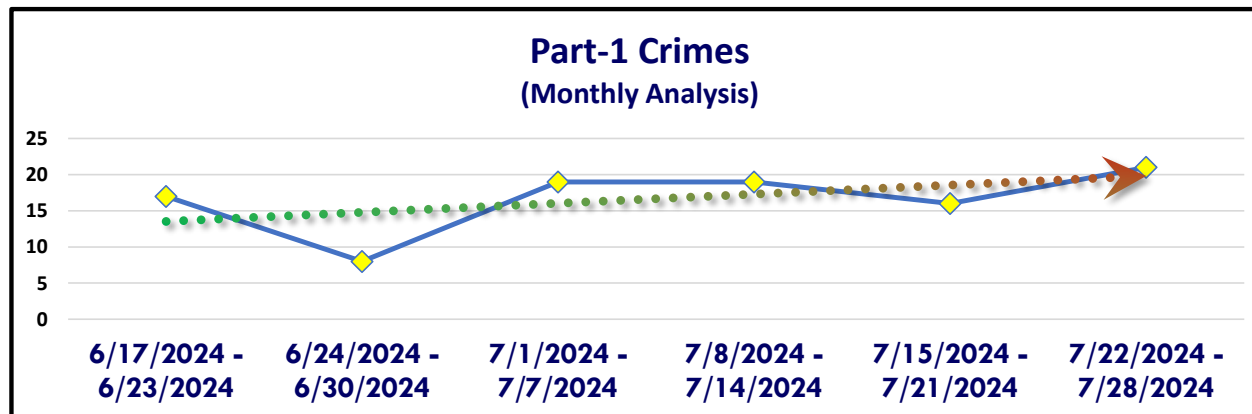
