HIGHLIGHTS & SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

ADMINISTRATIVE DIVISION

Recruiting, Academy and Training

- Recruited for a total of 59 hours at various locations in Miami-Dade County. This was at no cost to the City of NMB.
- Two Recruitment Team members attended the Homestead Air Force Base Police Week Expo and Recruitment Event.
- One Recruitment Team member attended the City of NMB's Young Men and Young Women of Distinction Scholarship Session.

- A total of 5 police officers are currently participating in the Field Training Officer Program. One police officer who is supposed to be participating in Field Training is currently out due to shoulder surgery.

HIGHLIGHTS & SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

OPERATIONS DIVISION

- **Road Patrol**
 - Calls for Service: 8539; Including: Watch Orders: 2713; Night Eyes: 867; Community Contacts: 995
 - 73 (33 felonies) arrests this month. 596 traffic stops.
- **Notable actions:**
- On May 2, 2025, Officers responded to 1880 NE 178 Street regarding a male armed with a machete and three victims. The incident began as a dispute over a parking space between tenants at 1880 NE 179 Street. During the argument, the suspect retrieved a machete from the main house and attacked the victims. One victim fled, another sustained arm and abdomen injuries, and a third suffered head trauma and was transported to Aventura Hospital. Officers responded and took the subject into custody.
- On May 8, 2025, units responded to an occupied burglary at 2042 NE 172 Street involving a victim's ex-boyfriend who had been harassing her for months. That evening, while the victim and her 6-year-old son were in the living room, the suspect attempted to break in through the front window, shattering it before fleeing. The suspect had previously been involved in multiple related incidents. The subject was located shortly thereafter and placed under arrest. The Detective Bureau and Crime Scene Unit responded to the scene.
- On May 13, 2025, officers responded to a burglary in progress in Highland Village involving a red Nissan that fled the scene. With assistance from MDSO Aviation, the vehicle was stopped at NE 22 Avenue and West Dixie Highway, where the male driver experienced a seizure and was transported to Aventura Hospital. At the original scene, a witness reported a physical altercation where the suspect assaulted another male and fired a gun at him. Video footage confirmed the suspect, the Nissan driver, punched the victim and then fired what was later identified as a BB gun. After being cleared from the hospital, the suspect was taken into custody and transported to TGK.
- On May 14, 2025, officers responded to 2145 NE 164 Street where a woman reported a heated argument with her boyfriend over text messages on her phone. During the dispute, the boyfriend forcefully took the phone from her and fled the scene. He was later located and taken into custody without incident. The phone was recovered from the suspect and returned to the victim.



HIGHLIGHTS & SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

- On May 17, 2025, officers responded to 16750 NE 9 Avenue regarding a vehicle burglary in progress. A witness reported 4–5 masked individuals in black hoodies trying car door handles. Officers Dorival and Laurent located and detained two males (one juvenile) and two females nearby, all matching the description. The females admitted to being lookouts while the males entered unlocked vehicles. One suspect was found with stolen items, including a prepaid card and school ID. A damaged vehicle was found nearby, but Crime Scene was not called due to contamination. Recovered property was impounded, and the group is believed to be involved in a series of recent unreported vehicle burglaries in the area.
- On May 23, 2025, a subject entered the Valero Gas Station at 1900 NE 163 Street, attempted to steal a beer, and threatened the clerk with scissors after being confronted. The subject fled as the clerk called 911. While a BOLO was issued, MDSO deputies spotted the suspect, who then threatened another victim with scissors and stole his sunglasses. The subject fled again but was apprehended near NE 162 Street and NE 16 Avenue. A show-up was conducted with a positive ID, and the subject was transported to TGK.
- On May 29, 2025, officers responded to a fire at 1300 NE 180 Street, where two occupants had already exited, and surrounding homes were evacuated. Miami-Dade Fire Rescue extinguished the fire by cutting through the roof, and the street was closed due to fire hydrant access. The residence housed eight tenants, and one of them, who initially called 911 and left the scene, returned and spontaneously admitted to starting the fire following an argument with a roommate involving alleged racial slurs. Her statements were recorded on body-worn camera. The Fire Investigator confirmed the fire was intentionally set. The Building Inspector and Fire Arson Investigator responded, with re-entry and inspection scheduled for the following morning. The Red Cross was contacted to assist displaced tenants, and the homeowner was notified of the damage.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP DIVISION

- The State of the City Address was worked on Wednesday, May 1, 2025, without incident.
- A Bike Refresher training was conducted on Thursday, May 2, 2025, without incident.
- Detective Nelson worked the National Day of Prayer on Thursday, May 2, 2025, with no reported incidents.
- Detectives Quinones and Nelson worked the Memorial for the Pope Event on Sunday, May 5, 2025, without incident.
- Detectives are scheduled to work the Small Business Summit & Expo on Thursday, May 8, 2025.
- Detectives are scheduled to work the Haitian Heritage Event on Friday, May 9, 2025.

- The Dive Team was called out on Tuesday, April 29, 2025, to assist the Detective Bureau in searching the surrounding area of Snake Creek Canal, where a victim had drowned.
- Detective Hernandez and Detective Vazquez-Bello conducted a threat assessment survey at the NMB Water Plant, which was submitted to the Chief via the chain of command.
- PAL Football and Cheer concluded on Saturday, May 3, 2025.
- Motors Unit handled a complaint regarding motorists blocking the intersection at Miami Gardens Drive and NE 19 Avenue. Enforcement was conducted, and Florida Highway Patrol was contacted for continued action as the area is under their jurisdiction.
- Four members of the Marine Patrol Unit successfully completed the Advanced Marine Patrol Tactics and Techniques Course during the week of May 6, 2025.
- Captain Wilson, Crime Prevention Specialist Rudow, and Youth Coordinator Roberts attended the 2025 Crime Prevention Summit in Tampa, Florida during the week of May 6, 2025.
- Community Policing Detectives assisted Humane Society Volunteers and a local resident in safely retrieving a litter of puppies from a home in Highland Village; the puppies were taken to the Humane Society for adoption.
- NMB PAL attended the 80th Annual National PAL Conference in Memphis, Tennessee, from Monday, May 13 to Friday, May 17, 2025.
- Planning has begun for National Night Out, scheduled for Monday, August 5, 2025.
- Farm Share is scheduled for Wednesday, May 22, 2025.
- Preparations are underway for the Memorial Day Event on Monday, May 26, 2025.



HIGHLIGHTS & SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

- Detective Hernandez is actively working with new apartment buildings to obtain emergency access for police. Progress has been made, with properties such as Lazul installing key boxes for law enforcement use.
- Community Policing has been conducting extra patrols in the NE 10 Avenue corridor and local synagogues due to the recent attack in Washington, D.C.
- Community Policing will respond to and investigate any potential hate crimes.
- Marine Patrol assisted Miami Beach PD with the Air & Sea Show. No incidents were reported.
- Shavuot Detail begins on Sunday, June 1, 2025, at 7:30 PM. Operations Plan is forthcoming.

INVESTIGATIVE DIVISION

- On May 7, 2025, the Tactical Investigation Unit (TIU) conducted undercover surveillance at 1755 NE 164 Street in response to a rise in nighttime burglaries. Officers observed a known burglary suspect dressed in black using a stolen ladder to access second-floor balconies and enter apartments while residents slept. The suspect, who attempted to evade arrest by changing clothes multiple times, was tracked across several blocks and ultimately apprehended by TIU. A female accomplice involved in the crimes was also arrested.
- On May 14, 2025, detectives responded to SLAM Charter School regarding written threats. A female student, suspended for cheating, allegedly made threats via FaceTime, saying she would have someone beat or shoot another student. She reportedly contacted a male suspect via Instagram, who threatened a student using the phrase "paint it up," interpreted as a shooting threat. Police traced the IP address to a Miami Gardens residence. No firearms were seen or directly mentioned. The suspects, social media acquaintances, were arrested and charged. The female suspect denied the threats post-Miranda. Police maintained a presence at the school to ensure safety.
- On Wednesday, May 28, 2025, the Tactical Investigation Unit, with valuable support from the Special Response Team (SRT), executed a meticulously planned search warrant at two locations: 16711 NE 19 Avenue and 1901 NE 167 Street. The coordinated operation demonstrated the units' commitment to public safety and effective law enforcement, culminating in the successful apprehension of one individual connected to the ongoing investigation. This collaborative effort highlights the department's dedication to disrupting criminal activity and maintaining community security.
- The Investigations Division made 7 arrests. TIU made 3 felony arrests. DB made 4 felony arrests.
