HIGHLIGHTS & SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

ADMINISTRATIVE DIVISION

Recruiting, Academy and Training

- Recruited for a total of 70.25 hours at various locations in Miami-Dade County. This was at no cost to the City of NMB.
- Recruitment events - NMBPD Recruitment Video being played in the selected movie theaters and Job News South Florida Job Fair.
- Multiple Recruitment efforts at Miami-Dade College in their Basic Law Enforcement and Correctional Officer Classes (Richard C. Slusher II, Aaron Winchester and Aymee Gonzalez).

- A total of 2 police officers and 1 Crime Scene Technician are currently participating in the new employee orientation program. One police officer who is supposed to be participating in Field Training is currently out due to shoulder surgery.

Communications

Answered approximately 1,891 incoming calls for police service.



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OPERATIONS DIVISION

- **Road Patrol**
 - Calls for Service: 7819; Including: Watch Orders: 2255; Night Eyes: 745; Community Contacts: 809
 - 114 (60 felonies) arrests this month. 621 traffic stops.
- **Notable actions:**
 - On September 9, 2025, at approximately 1543 hours, officers responded to a report of a vehicle burglary in progress at 1630 NE 168 Street. Upon arrival, dispatch provided a description of the suspect. Demonstrating prompt coordination and vigilance, Officers Gonzalez and Batista located a male matching the description at the corner of NE 16 Avenue and NE 169 Street. Through their swift and professional actions, the officers were able to safely apprehend the suspect without incident, preventing further criminal activity in the area.
 - On September 12, 2025, at 0130 hours, officers responded to 16750 NE 10 Avenue, Apt. 331, regarding a disturbance involving possible shots fired. Investigation revealed the female subject had taken the victim's firearm during an argument, pointed it at him, and racked the slide, ejecting a live round later recovered on the bedroom floor. Officers determined the subject threw the firearm from the third-floor balcony, and a search by Officer Cooper and Sergeant Aladin located it in a northside flower bed. The female subject was taken into custody without incident and transported to TGK.
 - On this September 21, 2025, the subject embarked on a robbery spree, beginning with an incident at Jiffy's. Detectives promptly obtained surveillance video, which provided a clear image of the suspect and led to a positive identification. Once the subject was identified, Officer J. Hernandez, along with additional dayshift officers, responded to the subject's residence. The team successfully located the suspect and placed him under arrest without incident.
 - Through the month of September, officers handled a variety of arrests and law enforcement actions, including multiple domestic violence cases, battery incidents, and resisting without violence. Significant arrests included aggravated assault with a firearm, strong-arm robbery, burglary of vehicles and residences, possession of controlled substances including cocaine and MDMA, possession of stolen credit cards, trespassing after warning, and bench and fugitive warrants. Officers also addressed serious incidents involving battery on law enforcement, hit-and-run with serious bodily injury, and fleeing from law enforcement, demonstrating proactive enforcement and coordinated response across multiple criminal activities.



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COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP DIVISION

Community Events & Outreach

- Ongoing logistical preparations for the Domestic Violence Awareness 5K.
- Assisted communication with Code and the Building Department regarding a residence where a search warrant was executed.
- Building access code for 2020 NE 169 Street obtained from management for police response.
- Ten Trespass After Warning signs distributed to Jefferson Plaza, apartment buildings in Government Center, and the Old Costco Plaza.

INVESTIGATIVE DIVISION

- On August 20, 2025, North Miami Beach Police responded to 2020 NE 169 Street and found a male city employee suffering from a gunshot wound to the chest. Despite officers' lifesaving efforts amid a hostile crowd, the victim was transported to Aventura Hospital, where he later died. Investigators determined that over thirty rounds had been fired by multiple shooters who fled on foot. The Criminal Investigation Division assumed the case, and a search warrant at 4900 NW 15th Court resulted in the arrest of one suspect, with two additional occupants taken into custody for outstanding warrants and a vehicle seized pending a warrant. An additional subject was later identified, and on September 2, 2025, the Tactical Investigative Unit conducted surveillance and apprehended the suspect along with a female and another male subject. Five firearms were recovered, including one stolen and two equipped with illegal switches.
- On June 16, 2025, at approximately 1111 hours, a male victim reported being attacked earlier that morning, between 0100 and 0400 hours, with an ice pick or screwdriver by a known subject at 15761 NE 15 Place. The victim was uncooperative with officers and declined transport to Aventura Hospital, later stating he was en route to Jackson North Hospital. The Detective Bureau was notified, and Crime Scene documented the victim's injuries. Following the investigation, the suspect was apprehended by the Tactical Investigative Unit on September 15, 2025.
- On Monday, September 15, 2025, the Tactical Investigative Unit (TIU) executed a search warrant at 1354 NE 163 Street. The operation resulted in the recovery of 10.26 pounds of cannabis, 46 edibles, and 1,544.5 grams of THC. One individual was arrested in connection with the investigation.
- On Tuesday, September 23, 2025, the Tactical Investigative Unit (TIU), with the assistance of the Special Response Team (SRT), executed a search warrant at 1825 NE 163 Street. The operation resulted in the seizure of \$11,502.50 and 5,479 grams of marijuana.



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- On Monday, September 29, 2025, NMBPD handled multiple reports of stolen and attempted stolen vehicles involving Kias and Hyundais. Officers responded to 1550 NE 168 Street (Grand Island) where several juveniles attempted to steal a Kia Optima but fled after failing, leaving the vehicle behind. The same group then attempted another theft near NE 162 Street and NE 14 Avenue, where TIU detectives intercepted them. The juveniles fled on foot, attempting to hide in backyards, but were quickly apprehended with assistance from TIU, K-9, Patrol, CID, Command Staff, Crime Scene, and Communications. Post-Miranda, two of the subjects admitted to the attempted thefts.
- On Monday, September 29, 2025, the Tactical Investigative Unit (TIU) executed a search warrant at 1921 NE 158 Street as part of an ongoing investigation. The operation was conducted in a coordinated and professional manner, resulting in the arrest of two individuals connected to the case. Evidence relevant to the investigation was also recovered during the execution of the warrant.
- The Investigations Division made 36 arrests. TIU made 5 felony arrests. The Detective Bureau made 31 arrests, 29 felony arrests, 1 bench warrant arrest, and 1 misdemeanor arrest.
