

What the CITT Fund Is

The CITT fund is money generated from a **local option sales surtax** approved by Miami-Dade County voters. The surtax is dedicated specifically to **transportation-related improvements** and is overseen by the **Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (also called CITT)**.

Municipalities like **North Miami Beach** receive an annual allocation of these funds from the County.

What CITT Funds Can Be Used For

CITT funds are **restricted** and must be used for transportation purposes, including:

- Roadway construction, resurfacing, and rehabilitation
- Traffic safety projects (roundabouts, traffic calming, striping, signage)
- Sidewalks, bike lanes, and pedestrian safety improvements
- ADA-compliant transportation infrastructure
- Transit-related capital projects
- Planning, design, and engineering tied to transportation projects

They **cannot** be used for general operating expenses or non-transportation capital projects.

Why Your Use Fits

The projects you listed are all **CITT-eligible**, including:

- The mini roundabout project
- East Drive pavement, restriping, and sidewalk repairs
- ADA improvements to a City-owned parking lot (because it serves transportation access)

That's why reallocating unused CITT funds to other **safety-related infrastructure** is both legally allowable and commonly done — as long as the use stays within transportation purposes.
